Publication of personal details restricted

IMPHAL: Following guidelines of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, the Government of Manipur has directed all departments and agencies under it to refrain from any act of publishing personal identity or confirmation like Aadhaar number and demographic details such as name, date of birth, address along with sensitive information like bank account details. In an official order dated April 15, secretary (IT) N Ashok Kumar stated that publishing such information is in clear contravention of the provisions of Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and Other Subsidies, Benefits and Services) Act 2016 and constitutes an offence under Section 37, 40 & 41, punishable with imprisonment upto three years. Further, publishing of financial information including bank account details is also contravention of provisions under IT Act, 2000 and such offending parties are liable to pay damage by way of compensation to the person affected.

CM reviews achievements of departments in 35 days

IMPHAL: Following the completion of 35 days in power, the BJP government led by chief minister Nongthombam Biren convened a review meeting for bringing a new administration at around 3 pm Thursday by deliberating on the development activities taken up and new development works under its 100-day programme.

The meeting presided over by the CM was attended by the cabinet ministers, chief secretary, principal secretary, secretaries, commissioners and other high ranking officials of various departments. Apart from discussing commendable works undertaken by the departments, the CM instructed to chalk out major developmental works that could be taken up during 100 days.

Not only the top department officials were asked to chalk out the developmental works that could be done within 100 days, they were also instructed to prepare strategies for achieving their objectives within the stipulated time.

The meeting also discussed the progress of various National Mission

Programmes funded by the Union government in the state. The CM also instructed officials concerned to take up necessary steps for directly transferring the benefits of centrally sponsored schemes to the bank accounts of beneficiaries.

According to sources, the government will review the achievements of each department and compare them. The transfer and postings of the department officials will be made after reviewing the achievement of their departments concerned.

A dash board will be installed at the CM's secretariat for enabling direct video conferencing with the Prime Minister's Office, various dis-

trict headquarters and top officials of all departments immediately to review the progress of development activities. Preparations are on for launching the technology from the CM's office.

The chief secretary and principal secretary have been instructed to detect the uncompleted projects even after adequate funds were deposited with Manipur Development Society in the last 10 years. The chief minister has also instructed to take legal actions against those responsible for failing to complete the projects despite the sanctioning of large amount of funds, sources added.

Union minister announces ₹22 crore package for tribal welfare in state

IMPHAL: Union tribal affairs minister **Jual Oram** has announced Rs 22 crore package for the welfare of tribals in Manipur for the fiscal year 2016-17.

Announcing the package during 37th foundation day celebration of BIP at Tengnoup Thursday, the Union minister said no one will be allowed to siphon off funds released for development purposes.

Speaking as chief guest at the function, Jual Oram said Central government's assistance towards development of tribals of the state has increased from Rs 12 crore in the year 2015-16 to Rs 22 crore in the current fiscal. The released fund include Rs 6 crore for upgradation of government primary schools, Rs 2 crore for provision of IT based education in government schools, Rs 1.2 crore for tribal students pursuing paramedical courses, Rs 90 lakh for mobile dispensary, Rs 75 lakh for improving infrastructure of three health institutions in tribal areas and Rs 3 crore for organic farming apart from many other development projects.

Informing that his two-day visit will include public programmes, meeting intellectuals and press conference, the Union minister, nonetheless, added that his visit is also to ensure implementation of Central government schemes in the state.

Claiming that people of the country are witness to non-partisan administration of the NDA government at the Centre for three years now, Jual Oram said Prime Minister Narendra Modi works in the spirit of collective development and hence BJP could rule in four out of five states where assembly elections were held recently.

Assuring befitting action against any corrupt minister, MLA or bureaucrat, the

Union minister appealed to the people to inform the Centre through mail or letter if they encounter any corrupt activity.

While lauding the people of Manipur for voting BJP to power, Jual Oram said the party could secure 36 percent of votes with 21 MLAs in the recently conducted state assembly elections though it could secure only two seats with 2 percent vote share in the last hustling.

Informing that his two-day visit will include public programmes, meeting intellectuals and press conference, the Union minister, nonetheless, added that his visit is also to ensure implementation of Central government schemes in the state.

Asserting that BJP believes in people-oriented governance and that no ministers will be allowed to accumulate personal wealth from public fund, Jual Oram advised party workers to understand Narendra Modi's ideology.

Machine failure compels patient to leave RIMS operation theatre

IMPHAL: A patient, who was wheeled inside the operation theatre after completing all procedures for surgery, has been reportedly asked to leave without conducting the operation on the ground that the operating machine is not functional.

Addressing media persons in this regard at Manipur Press Club on Thursday, one Angom Sanatomba informed that his niece Silvia Angom (9) had complaint of stomach ache. According to the advice of a doctor, her CT scan and x-ray were

taken. Later it was informed that surgery is necessary to remove a swelling inside the stomach near her heart.

Subsequently, she was referred to RIMS for the said operation under the guidance. After a long wait, the day for the operation was fixed on Wednesday by the doctor.

On the advice of the doctor, all necessary arrangements including medicines that were required for the operation were made and the patient was finally taken inside the operation theatre room.

Imphal-Jiri road finally travel-friendly

IMPHAL: After years of public dissatisfaction over the road repair work taken up along Imphal-Jiribam road by Border Road Organisation, the route has improved significantly after National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL) took over the task from BRO on March 27, 2016.

A team of media persons spotted that road repair works were being taken up on a war footing.

Chief minister Nongthombam Biren is scheduled to inspect the road repair works on April 22. He had instructed engineers concerned to send pictures of the road repair works daily on WhatsApp to check the progress made.

Union Road Transport and Highways minister Nitin Gadkari announced the launch of 11 highway projects and a Rs 22,000 crore package for un-

dertaking these projects on December 11 last year during his visit to the state. The union minister also assured to hand over the road repair work to NHIDCL as BRO was not able to make any progress in all these years.

Following his announcement, three private companies started repair works on war footing. The road stretch from Imphal to Awangkhul (from 3 km till 75 km) is being repaired by MSHVS Construction Mate-

rials Private Limited from first week of March onwards. The dredging of drains and mending of potholes in this section are being taken up by using various heavy machines. The second section from Awangkhul to Barak (from 75 km to 145 km) is being handled by MS Nidhi Creative Infrastructure Private Limited while from Barak to Jiribam (185 km to 220 km) the task is assigned to MS Bhartiya Infra Projects Limited.

One killed, six hurt in accidents

IMPHAL: One passenger died while five others suffered injuries when a diesel autorickshaw collided with a car Thursdays near Lilong Tairenpokpi under Lilong police station.

The deceased identified as Md Aslam Khan, 24, son of Alimuddin of Lilong Chingkham Makha Dam succumbed to injuries at Raj Medcity, North AOC.

Eye witnesses said the passenger carrier collided with a car (A-Star) coming towards Imphal from Thoubal side about 1.30pm.

The injured passengers are Anuri, 38, wife of Md Abdul Barik of Chingol Tharaokhok; Md Khalique, 23, son of Md Majiz of Lilong Mai-remkun; Md Kayamuddin son of late Alimuddin of Lilong Chingkham Makha and Matama wife of late Abdullah also of Lilong Chingkham Makha.

Khaiarentang residents wary of recurring landslides

UKHRUL: As Utkhrul continues to experience heavy downpours ahead of monsoon, several families living in sunken homesteads located at a roadside residential pocket of Khaiarentang are living with growing apprehension of recurring landslides that hit the neighborhood last year.

It may be mentioned that several homesteads, plots and road culverts in Khaiarentang remained cracked and vulnerable after a range of slow-moving landslides triggered by torrential rains last year. While a house belonging to former chairman of the local development committee namely Zingthan Varam had been

partially ravaged and another house displaced, cracks also developed at several other unoccupied plots. Besides, two concrete culverts along the roadway are also sinking gradually.

"My family is in constant fear of

being struck by fresh landslides each moment heavy rains start to fall," Zingthan Varam said, adding that his homestead was left with full of cracks after steady landslides carried away one third of his plot and destroyed eight rooms of his home last year.

Varam continued that initially the impact seemed slow, but the cracks got wider over the past few months due to heavy rainfalls.

"When it rains heavily, we can see the mass of earth starting to move stealthily from the slopes where cracks have appeared," he observed, and continued "we know that this is like an impending danger, but being poor, we have no means to vacate or take any precautionary measures."

'Insurgency related violence dips in NE including Manipur'

IMPHAL: Though the north eastern region of India is inhabited by different communities and a large number of insurgent groups operate here thereby creating a complex situation, insurgency related violence in the region has considerably decreased in recent years, according to an annual report released by Union ministry of home affairs.

The ministry report stated that violent incidents in the Northeast in 2015, dipped from 1,489 in 2007 to 574 in 2015. In 2016, 484 insurgency related violence were recorded, indicating a 15% decline. Comparatively, 2016 had least cases of insurgency related violence since 1997.
